




Far greater than we know.



He enjoyed all sports and he played most of them at some point. While living in Detroit attending Whitney Young School, he was a member of Puppeteers Chess Team.


David traveled quite a bit growing up because his dad was a career military man. David followed somewhat along the same military path for a few years. He received an honorable discharge from the military in 1987.
