Obituary

- 1918 to 2014 -

Sister Earselene Wallace Goodwin was born into this life on July 24, 1918 to parents: James Chancy and Bulah Wallace, in the land of Monticello, Mississippi. She was one of three siblings born into the family. Being the only girl, she was graced with two brothers: James, Jr. and Freddie Wallace.

Sister Goodwin, affectionately called by those that knew her, as simply Mom, received her primary education at Lawrence County High School, located in her hometown of Monticello, MS.

Mom would later marry into the Goodwin family becoming the wife of Morris Goodwin, Sr., on June 14, 1947. To their family union God would add two children: Morris, Jr. and Pamela Jean. The marriage union would last until natural death announced separation. Morris Goodwin, Sr. would go home to be with the Lord on January 05, 2002, after serving nearly 55 years in the marriage.



Sister Goodwin's work history included: LeRoy Howard Cafe, where she was employed as a waitress, the Singer Sewing Machine Company, and the Government Munitions Plant and Facility, to name a few business establishments she was employed by in her journey. She also served at various other work assignments, not listed here, before joining the roll of nonworking retirees, in 1951.

Mom would engender an extensive church relationship. Coming to believe in the Lord, Jesus Christ, at an early age, she was accordingly baptized (in the creek, outside of the church location) while attending the Friendship Baptist Church, located in Mississippi, under the leadership, at the time, of Pastor Cooper. Soon after relocating to Minneapolis, Minnesota she would take membership within the Bethesda Baptist Church family, in midyear 1948, which at the time was under the leadership of Pastor J.S. Tate. During her journey with Bethesda church, she served faithfully on several ministries and auxiliaries: the Mission Ministry, which involved rather famously a Habitat for Humanity Partnership; perhaps, however, her most prominent church contribution was singing in the Senior Choir.

Mom's church work will stand above many others for long duration. However, her work for the Kingdom of God, through the use of her very special Spiritual gifts, will best define her work and life while on earth. Mom Goodwin lived at the summit, with few others, as a chief communicator. Spiritually, she was empowered to speak Grace, God's Grace and Truth into the lives of people from every walk of life: from the downtrodden to the most privileged amongst us. With her million-dollar smile, full genuine laughter, with the voice and words of comfort she warred against the wicked deeds of the devil. Yes, she can truly proclaim "The Work that I've Done, Speak for Me."

Sister Earselene Goodwin departed this life in the evening hours on Friday, August 22, this year, headed home to be with the Lord. She was preceded in death by her loving parents, her two brothers, and her beloved husband: Morris Goodwin, Sr. She leaves to cherish her memories: her son, Morris, Jr. (wife Donna), daughter Pamela Jean Goodwin, and a step-daughter, Earline Holmes and her family. Also, her grandchildren: Morris III and Lindsay Nicole Goodwin, John (wife Shonita) Nehemiah Harper, Ashley Stepney; and, great-grandchildren: Elizabeth Michelle Harper, Daeshawn, and Mia. Additionally, she leaves a host of long-term family and friends abroad and locally. A Spiritual son and pastor, Rev. Arthur (wife Bobbie Jean) Agnew, a God-daughter and her family: Sister Ruth Hall, a very close friend: Sister Annie English, along with a large number of those she touched deeply during her years of witnessing for Christ, at Bethesda Church, and throughout the nation. Mom will truly be missed as a moral creature constantly in communion with God and community (she truly loved people). Mom, sleep well!
