Nolan James Walker was born in Lafayette, Louisiana to Beatrice Walker & Earl Breaux. He was the 4th child born to this union & was the younger of a set of twins. In 1962, Beatrice relocated her family to Flagstaff, Arizona where she met & married A.D. Erving. In 1966, the family relocated to Monticello, MS. Nolan accepted Christ at an early age & joined the Friendship Missionary Baptist Church where he was baptized. Nolan was an active member of Friendship & was a member of the choir, usher board, Sunday school & BTU. Nolan attended Sophia Sutton Head start, McCullough Attendance Center/McCullough Jr. High School & graduated from Monticello High School. After high school, Nolan served briefly in the United States Marine Corps.
